If you are within 10 miles of the nuclear power plant, it is a big part of the emergency plan for your county. Do not rely on the county to evacuate your programs on buses. They do not have the resources available to do so. You will need to have a plan in place including where you will go should the need arise. Programs could be contacted by public health to ensure that they are aware of a nuclear emergency. Programs will be allowed to go to a reception center that will be open during the emergency and those locations will be given within the emergency information that is given out if your program resides within the 10 mile radius. Ready Monti app on your cellular phone is the nuclear prepare plan for residents.

Emergency Notifications

Citizen Alert service allows the county to alert you during an emergency. You opt-in to enter your contact information and subscribe to notifications you care about based on your location. The information you provide is protected and will not be used for any other purpose. When the county issues a notification about a potential safety hazard or concern, you will receive a message on the voice or text communication methods that you have registered. If requested for the notification, you can confirm that you have received the message and you will not be contacted by any subsequent methods regarding that particular notification. If you do not confirm, the system will continue to attempt to reach you at all of the contact methods that you have provided.

If you have damage to your home or surrounding property due to an emergency/disaster contact:

- City/Township Offices: The county can obtain damage report information from local officials as needed
- County Licensor: Let them know whether you are open or closed (763) 682-7485
- Milestones: Can provide assistance with grant eligibility and back-up care options available for families (320) 251-5081
