DIRECTIONS & PARKING

Atwood Memorial Center SCSU 651 1st Ave S; St. Cloud, MN 56301

<u>From I-94:</u> Take Exit 171 into St. Cloud. Follow Stearns County Road 75 for 3.5 miles. Turn right at the intersection of County Road 75 and Cooper Avenue. This roadway become University Drive. Drive east on University Drive for about 14 blocks. Turn left and drive north on Ninth Avenue South. Go four blocks and turn right onto Sixth Street South.

<u>From U.S Highway 10:</u> Exit west from U.S. Highway 10 to Highway 23. Cross the Mississippi River on the Granite Crossing Bridge. Turn south on Fifth Avenue South. Turn east on Sixth Street South.

<u>Parking</u>: Parking will be available in the 4th Avenue Parking Ramp at no cost. You will still need to take a receipt but will receive a validation sticker during the morning Keynote session. Street and lot parking is free on the weekends, but there is no guarantee that spots will be available.

B1 Supporting the Development of Regulation through Co-Regulation: Children Need YOU! Co-regulation is crucial to the childhood development of emotion regulation. When children struggle with self-regulation, it is difficult for them to sit still, concentrate, and participate in learning activities. Before children learn how to make a friend or resolve a conflict, they first need to develop the capacity to self-regulate their emotions.

Discuss the importance of emotional regulation in young children and the role educators play in building regulation & co-regulation. Explore the elements and conditions needed for children to develop regulation & co-regulation. Examine strategies and tips to support the growth of self-regulation through co-regulation.
